We are an independent charity, but members of the national Third Age Trust. We maintain relationships with other local U3As through the South Cheshire Cluster group, and the North West network.

Trustees have considered risks and take professional advice as appropriate. We have clear financial guidelines, adequate insurance cover through our national body, and a sensible reserves policy. We do not employ staff, or hold leases or property.

The object of Knutsford U3A is the advancement of education, and in particular the education of older people and those who are retired from full time work, by all means, including associated activities conducive to learning and personal development.

Knutsford and District U3A is a self-help learning organisation for all local retired people, who wish to join in activities that will develop learning, skills, personal development, enjoyment and friendship.

We have three main kinds of activities. We hold monthly Members Meetings with a speaker on a very wide variety of topics, followed by refreshments and social interaction afterwards.

We currently have 52 different Activity Groups offering a range of learning experiences to suit different interests- ranging from Tai Chi, Table Tennis and Walking Football, to Bridge, several languages, poetry, and history, for example. These are led by Co-ordinators giving their time as U3A volunteers. Co-ordinators are supported with networking and training sessions that help them to provide their members with a good experience.

We organise many outings to places of interest, as well as many theatre and concert trips to different venues.

We also produce a regular newsletter to keep members informed of our activities, and those available in the wider U3A network, such as Summer Schools.

All trustees have regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit, helping us to plan activities.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Achievements and performance

Our membership has continued to grow, and at the end of March 2019 stands at 703 members, plus 34 Associate members (who are also members of another local U3A). We average 8 new members each month.

We have welcomed several new Activity Groups, including Architecture, Digital Photography, Tennis, Italian for Beginners, an extra book group (the sixth one), History, and a second Tai Chi group.

The Committee now organises three events that support our organisation to develop and thrive. In the Spring, we hold a training/network day for Co-ordinators and those key members in the organisation who undertake the backbone of the work involved- such as the technical team, Outings Committee, Speakers Committee etc. In the Autumn we hold a networking morning with a topic, so that these key members can share ideas and experiences that all help to develop our organisation for the public benefit.

In September, we held a second open 'Showcase' event, with displays of many Activity Groups, so that the public can get a better idea of what we do, members can find out more about different Activity Groups, and the groups themselves can attract new members. It's also a very popular opportunity to network with other Co-ordinators and share ideas.

The Outings sub Committee organised over 10 trips to places of interest locally and further afield, together with 6 plays, an opera, 3 concerts, a musical and 2 ballets. Two members organised a concert in Knutsford, which was particularly welcomed by those members who find it hard to travel distances.

Trustees had extensive discussions on many topics, ranging from the need for new financial systems, privacy and data protection polices (GDPR), to the provision of refreshments at monthly Members Meetings. We recruited three new members to join the Trustee team, who will be standing for election at the AGM. This builds our strength as an organisation.

Our reserves policy is to maintain a level of reserves at a figure of 6 months running costs of our 'core' organisation, (which does not include the income and expenditure of the Activity Groups, outings etc, all of which are self-funding). This level of reserves is to allow for contingencies, such as the need to replace equipment and unexpected expenses. Currently, our level of reserves is above the 6 months level, so the trustees have taken steps to reduce our income, by lowering the membership fee for the coming year, and to monitor the situation carefully.
